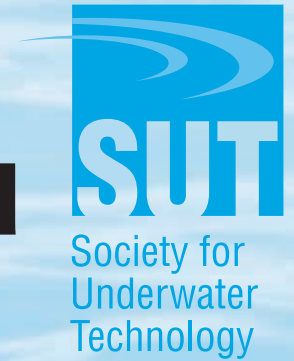

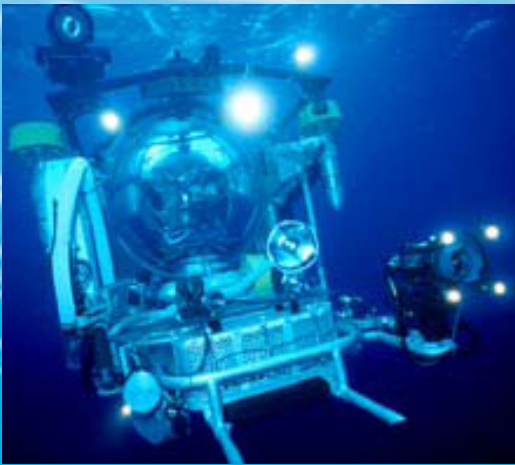

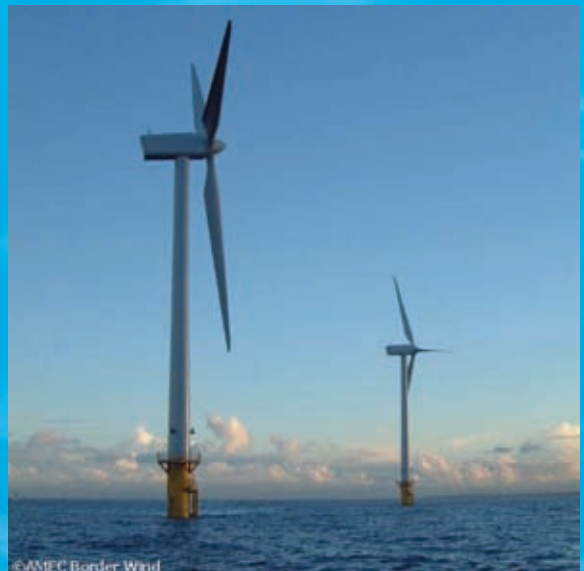
### Aims of the day
